Just hold on until tomorrow.*

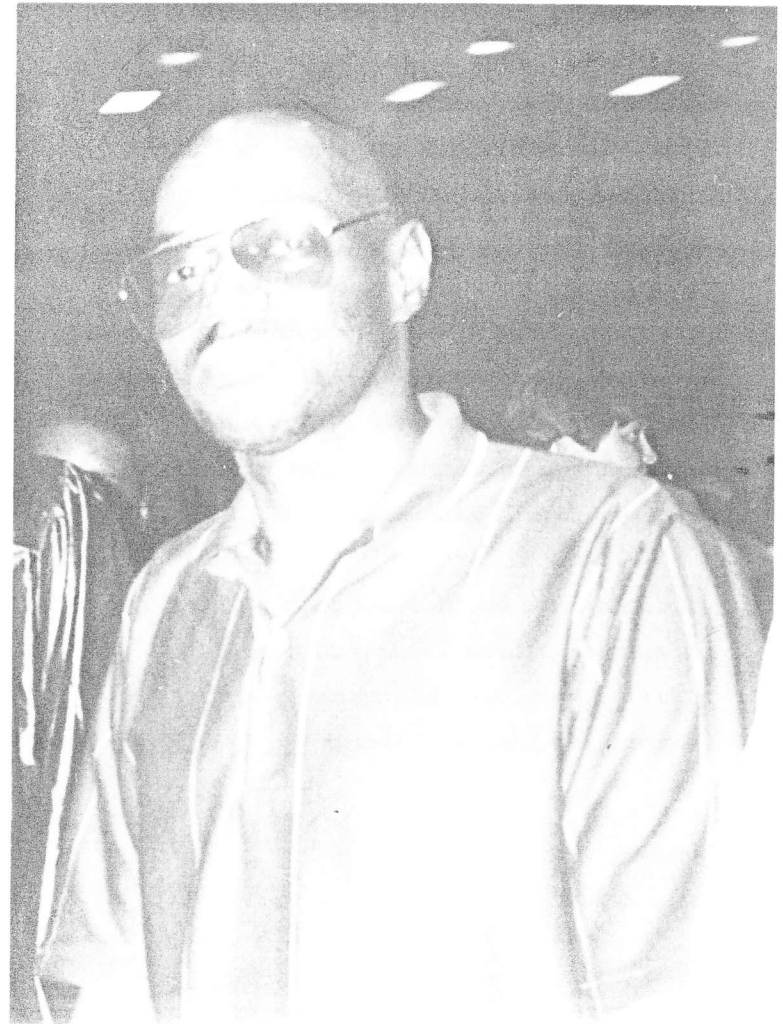
*You must be given a cross to bear
