Replication to Plea in
Abatement

Comes the solicitor, and for replication to the defendant's pleas, and to each ground thereof, and to each plea, says:

When the jury box was set before the Judge, he opened the box in the presence of the Sheriff and the Clerk of the Court, and began shuffling the cards contained in the jury box, picking up double handfuls of the cards and turning and thoroughly mixing the contents of the jury box. While so shuffling the cards contained in the jury box, the judge discovered that three cards contained in the box were clipped together with a gem type paper clip. When he completed the shuffling, he picked up the three cards so clipped together, looked at the first card of the three, and without comment as to whose name was on the card, and without comment of any kind by anyone present, he allowed the three cards, still clipped together to fall back into the jury box. He then began drawing cards from the box one at a time and without looking at any card, handed it to the Clerk. No card drawn singly by the Judge was returned to the jury box, and no comment was made by anyone present as to whose name had been drawn.

After the Judge completed drawing the jury for the first week of the session, he announced that he would draw the jury for the second week of the session, and when this was completed, he then announced that he would draw the jury for the third week of the session. When this was completed, he closed the jury box, looked it and handed it to the Sheriff. Some of those present at the drawing disbursed. About fifteen minutes later and after some of those present at the original drawing had returned to the office of the Clerk of the Circuit Court, the Judge instructed the Sheriff to open Court. The Sheriff opened Court, and in the presence of the Sheriff and the Clerk of the Court, the Judge again opened the Jury box and withdrew from it three cards clipped together with a gem type paper clip. These were the only cards in said jury box which were clipped together. The judge handed the three cards to the Clerk of the Court and instructed him to add them to the list which had been drawn for the first week of the session.

The three cards which were clipped together in the jury box came to be there in the following manner: At the last session of the jury commission, they found cause to believe that one of the men whose name appeared on one of the cards was dead; that the other two men whose names appeared on the cards had moved out of the State and were no longer residents of Limestone County, Alabama. Mrs. Alma Puryear, an employee in the Office of the Clerk of the Circuit Court was assisting the jury commission at such session as stenographer and typist. In order to indicate that the cards of the three men were to be removed from the jury box, she clipped them together with a gem type paper clip. However by accident or inadvertance, the three cards were returned to the jury box still clipped together.

All of which the solicitor is ready to verify, and he prays judgment that the defendant be convicted of the premises in said indictment alleged.

Plea in Abatement

Comes the defendant in the above styled cause appearing specially and only for the purpose of filing these pleas and says that the State of Alabama ought not to have and maintain said indictment against the defendant and as Pleas sets out and assigns separately and severally the following to-wit:

1. The grand jurors who found the indictment were not drawn in the manner provided for by law.
2. The grand jurors who found the indictment were not drawn from the jury box by the officer designated by law to draw the same.
3. The grand jurors who found the indictment were not drawn from the jury box in the manner provided for by law.
4. The grand jury was drawn from the jury box in the Circuit Clerk's office and at such time and place when the judge opened the jury box and started drawing names from said jury box the Judge drew out of said jury box 3 or 4 cards which were clipped together and replaced said names in said jury box.
5. Several names drawn from said jury box were allowed to fall out of said jury box on the desk in the Clerk's office and were later replaced in said box.
6. After the Court was adjourned the solicitor notified some of the attorneys to reappear in court whereupon the jury box was again opened and the Judge thereupon proceeded to pick out some names on cardboard which were clipped together in said jury box. At this time the clerk of the court was in the same room but was writing out a receipt and was not standing with the sheriff and Judge at the time the Judge picked out the several names which were clipped together.
7. The grand jury drawn from the jury box were not drawn but were selected inasmuch as the names clipped together were drawn, later replaced, and later redrawn.
8. The charge against the defendant in this case is a felony and to try him on the indictment in this case would deprive him of the rights guaranteed to him under Section 6 of Article 1 of the Constitution of Alabama, 1901, in that he would thereby be deprived of life or liberty without due process of law in that no indictment has been returned in this case conforming to due process.
9. The grand jury was formed by selecting names instead of drawing names from the jury box as provided for by law.
10. The indictment found by the grand jury which said grand jury was selected by names being clipped together where one could not be selected without selecting all was not done in the manner provided for by law; said names being selected rather than drawn.
11. After the jury box was closed and the attorneys left the Circuit Clerk's office, the Solicitor notified some of the attorneys to reappear, whereupon the jury box was again opened and the Judge thereupon proceeded to pick out or select some names on cardboard which were clipped together in said jury box. For aught that appears, these names which were clipped together on cardboard were not the same names which had previously been drawn by the Judge.
12. At the time the jury box was first opened in the Circuit Clerk's office, the Sheriff did not open Court.
13. The petit juries were selected at the same time the grand jury was and said selection was void because of the same reasons and grounds set out hereinabove as to the grand jury.

Wherefore the defendant says that the Circuit Court of Limestone County, Alabama, is without jurisdiction to try and determine this cause and that this indictment should be abated and that the validity of the venire facias juratores and general venire out of which the grand jury was formed, held for naught. And the defendant says that the petit juries selected should be abated and the validity of the same held for naught.

DEMURRER TO REPLICATION

Now comes the defendant and demurs to the replication filed by the State of Alabama in the above styled case and as grounds for said demurrer sets out and assigns the following:

1. The replication fails to state any legal defense to the defendant's pleas in abatement.
2. The replication is not a sufficient answer or defense to the defendant's pleas in abatement.
3. Sufficient facts are not alleged which would constitute a defense to said pleas in abatement.
4. The alleged action on the part of the Jury Commission and on the part of Mrs. Alma Puryear, the clerk or typist for the Jury commission or the act of anyone else in clipping the three cards together is no answer to the defendant's plea in abatement.
5. The fact, if it be a fact, that any of the jurors were dead whose names appeared on the cards which were clipped together or had moved out of the County or how said cards were clipped in the jury box is no defense to the plea in abatement and is res inter alios acta.
