You don't know how much I enjoyed the childrens visit and it just broke me all up when they left. I think they had a pretty good time, hope they did at any rate. "Baby" seemed to have something drawing her home, of course I could'nt guess what it was, otherwise, Sarah would have stayed several days longer.

Hope you enjoyed your trip to Ashville and rec'd a lot of benefit from it. You should have come to Denver, know it would have done you lots of good. I have just gotten a phone message from Woody Simmons inviting me out to take dinner this eve. with Col. Sanders, know I will enjoy it. Took dinner with Tom a few nights ago at Mrs. Blakes and certainly enjoyed seeing him.
