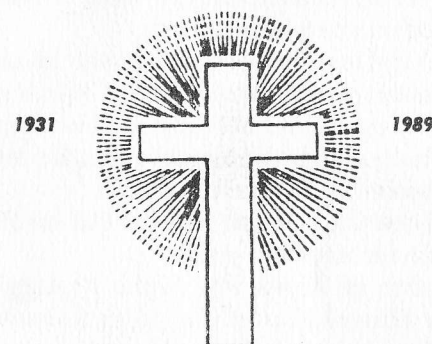

## OBITUARY

Mr. Wilson E. Leslie, Jr., was born on January 1, 1931 in Limestone County, Alabama. He was the first child born to Wilson Leslie, Sr. and Aver French Leslie. He answered his call from the Heavenly Father on January 14, 1989 at the veteran hospital in Indianapolis, Indiana.
