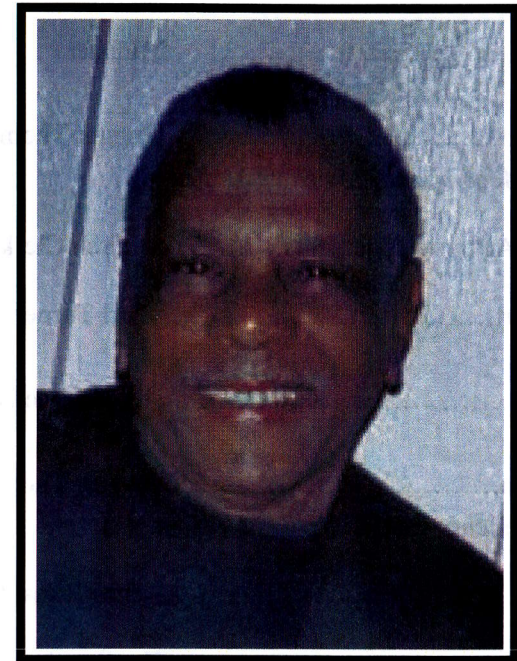

Robert McWilliams was born July 2, 1934 in Athens, Alabama to Sallie and Freeman McWilliams. He graduated from Trinity High School in Athens, Alabama. He then attended Central State University in Wilberforce, Ohio earning a Bachelor's Degree in Business Administration.

He relocated to Cleveland, Ohio and there he met and married Barbara Jean Allen in 1964. In 1969, their only child, Daughter Robin Evette was born.

Robert began his career working at the United States Postal Service, which was interrupted by the United States Army when he was drafted.
