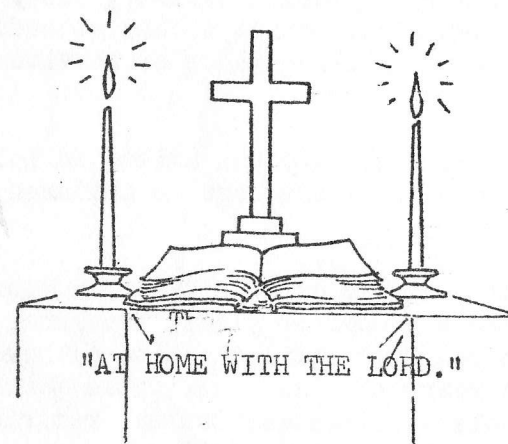

Mrs. Johnnie D. Horton was born to Mr. Jackson and Mrs. Pearl Alexander Dawson in Elkmont, Alabama.

At an early age she confessed hope in Christ and joined the Cumberland Presbyterian Church. She was baptized by the late Reverend Newton Woodruff, Athens, Alabama.

For thirty-five years, she served as secretary of the Huntsville Presbyterial Society; also, secretary of the Alabama Synodical Society. She attended her Church regularly, always willing to be of service whenever needed.

On April 19, 1935, she was united in Holy Matrimony to William Horton. There were no children born to this union.

Mrs. Horton served as an officer in Naomi Star Chapter #653, for a number of years; treasurer of the Matrons' Cultural Club until the time of her death. For thirty-five years she was a dedicated teacher in the public schools of Limestone County, retiring from Dogwood Junior High School in 1965.

She leaves to mourn her passing, a devoted husband, William Horton; two sisters, Mrs. Sammie D. Mason and Mrs. Mattie Mosely; five nieces; five nephews; eleven grandnieces and nephews; and a host of cousins.
