Obituary

David Luke Farrar, the oldest of eight siblings, was born to Deacon Leonard Farrar Sr. and Mother Lillie Phelps Farrar on October 22, 1919 in Limestone County, Alabama.

David openly confessed hope in Christ at an early age and joined St. Paul Missionary Baptist Church. He was a faithful member.

In later years, he relocated and joined Poplar Creek Missionary Baptist Church under the Pastorage of Dr. Clarence Johnson, where he continued to be a faithful servant.

He also served in the U. S. Army.

He was a Professor of Chemistry at Tennessee State University for many years and later returned to his Alma Mater, Fisk University to work in the same capacity until retirement.
