Dear Harry:

Your very generous offer sometime ago to see that justice is done in case the newspaper publishers should try to take advantage of other publishers impels me to write you about the Chichester bill. (House No. 179)

This bill exempts newspapers from its operation but not magazines. This could be cured by a very slight amendment to Section 4, line 6, adding after the word advertising the words "and shall not apply to magazines or magazine advertising."

Unless you are a great deal better I certainly do not want you to write Mr Robinson, the speaker pro tem, or anyone else about this matter, but just forget it.

I certainly do hope you are better. Unless you are better I feel sure Mrs Walker will veto any idea of your exerting yourself on this relatively minor matter.
