

How the Speakership race look to you, now that the Graves forces have won such a substantial victory? To me, it would seem that the nomination of Graves would be largely in your favor, because it is reasonably certain that Graves adherents will control the organization of the House. Whilst I did not actively support Graves locally, I was a Graves man, and expect to work as fully as possible, in harmony with Graves forces, not only in organizing the legislature, but the matter of legislation generally.

I have heard so far from but two opponents that you will have in the Speakership race, these being Hon Chauncy Sparks of Eufaula, and Hon A. L. Hanks of Talladega. My opinion is that you will stand better with the Graves forces than either of these others mentioned.

I have a letter from Mr. Graves respecting some conferences with members-elect of the legislature, respecting legislation next winter, and perhaps you have also heard from him. I think it would be a most excellent thing for Graves supporters and other leaders to begin as early as possible to map out a plan of action.
