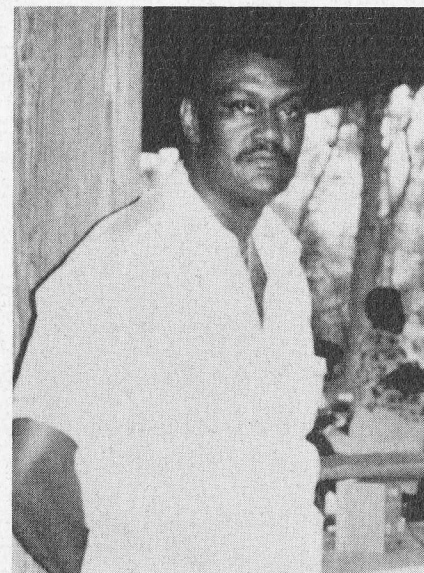

Obituary

John L. Lane, Jr. was born on November 23, 1939 in Athens, Alabama, to the loving parents of Maude Ella (Beddingfield) and John Lane, Sr. (both deceased). He was one of seven children. 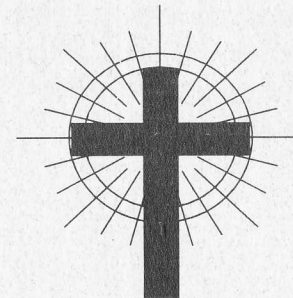
