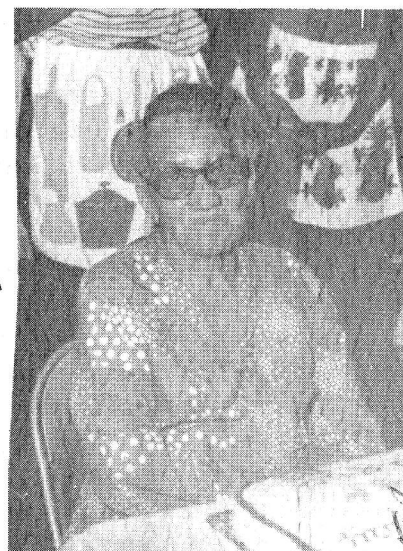
No Day is Lost
