with us. It is a sort
of duplex apartment which
can easily be used by
two families. We are very
well satisfied for the
present, at least, but of
course a more convenient
location and a better

apartment would have
a strong appeal.

We were very
fortunate in buying
our household necessities
as Bill had a friend
in a hardware store
here who gave us a
good percentage off and
made us a present of
a splendid percolator,
beside a flashlight and
one or two smaller
articles.

We are getting some lovely
gifts and I'll send you a
list later in order that
you may know something

remembered us on this occasion.

It looks as though it
will be some time in
your regard. Bill can get
his vacation but when he

be glad to spend it with
you. We are rather anxious
to return to Athens for at
least a two weeks visit.
