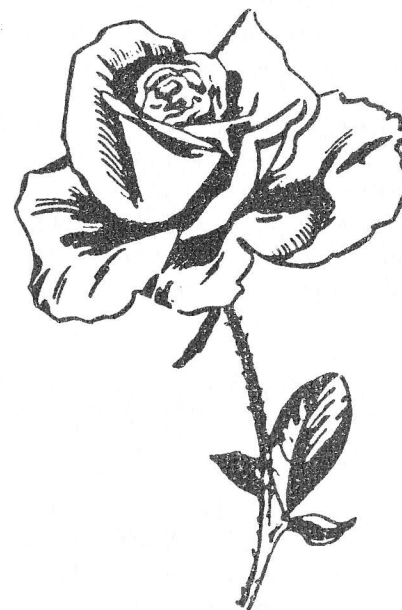

Obituary

Frances Rose Fairrer Cain was born February 23, 1923, in Limestone County, Alabama. She departed this life on Thursday, July 29, 1993, at 11:38 a.m. at the Huntsville Hospital, Huntsville, Alabama.

She attended the public schools of Limestone County, Alabama (Big Creek).

Mother Frances Cain confessed hope in Christ at the Alabama Fork Church under the pastorate of Rev. Walter Crutcher in July, 1937. She then joined the St. Luke Missionary Church on August 7, 1937, and was baptized on September 11 of the same year. For many years, Mother Cain taught the primary class in Sunday School, sang in the Senior Choir, and served on the Mother Board until her health failed. She enjoyed her church work and was always concerned about the progress of St. Luke--never faltering in her commitment to serve in the church.

While she enjoyed her work in the church, Mother Cain was also a "family woman" who loved her family and was always concerned about her children's welfare and happiness, as well as the welfare and happiness of others. Even during some of the most difficult periods of her illness, she continued to think about others and expressed it again and again. She would say, "take care of yourself", "be sure to get some rest", and "y'all take care of the children."

Frances worked for many years in Athens and took pride in everything she did. She gave her best--and continued to do that as long as her health permitted her to do so.

Frances Rose and Lankford Cain, Sr. were married on April 21, 1940, and became the parents of Lankford, Jr., William Edward, And Thomas Glenn. Their children were reared with the love of God, family ties, education and work ethic stressed in the home continuously because Frances Rose always wanted the best for her "sons" and later on for their families.

Mother Cain leaves to mourn her passing: a devoted husband, Lankford Sr., three sons, Lankford, Jr. (Bettye) of Huntsville, Alabama; William Edward (Ruby) of Nashville, Tennessee; and Thomas Glenn (Phllis) of Nashville, Tennessee; six grandchildren, four step-grandchildren; five great grandchildren; three nieces, seven nephews, and a host of other relatives to friends.

Mother Frances Rose Fairrer Cain can best be described as a "warrior," a lady who fought a good fight, finished her course, and has gone home to be with the Lord.
