Ordered that Commissioners W. G. Arnett, Russell Balch and E. M. Taylor make an inspection of the Mooresville-Big Limestone Road in Beat # 11. It is ordered that the County Engineer employ wagons and teams to put on approximately 200 cubic yards of gravel for repair work on that section of the Snake Road between the Florence and the Jack Bats corner provided the same can be had at a reasonable price.

Ordered that the Commissioners make an inspection of the proposed R. O. W. of the old Mooresville and Ft. Hampton road lying between the Athens-Browns Ferry road and the "Mail" road in Beat # 10 for the purpose of such adjustments of R. O. W. as can be made with the property owners.

Ordered that the Commissioners make an inspection on Aug. 21 of River Road along Tennessee River from the Decatur Ferry site to the mouth of Big Limestone Creek and up Limestone creek to the Mooresville-Decatur Road.

Ordered that the Commissioners make an inspection of certain bridge and roads with the County Engineer in Beats 15, 4 and 3.

Ordered that an appropriation not to exceed \$25.00 be made from the General Fund for the use in paying camp expenses of the Girls Club of Limestone County under the supervision of the Home Demonstration Agent, payable by Probate Judge upon presentation of the account.

Court adjourned to meet Sept. 9, 1929.

Court met pursuant to adjournment on Monday, it being the 9th day of Sept. 1929. There was present and presiding the Hon. A. M. McConnell, Judge of Probate and Ex Officio Chairman of said Court. Ordered that the Tax assessor be authorized to have counter desk raised and the Judge of Probate issue warrant in payment for same when done.

Ordered that the salary of West Waters as janitor for Court House be reduced from \$90.00 per month to \$75.00 per month and he be relieved of all duties pertaining to the white ladies rest room and the Judge of Probate be authorized to employ a white lady janitress for same at a salary of \$30.00 per month the same to be effective at once.

Ordered that Com E. M. Taylor, be authorized to make trade for R. O. W. for that part of Mooresville & Ft. Hampton Road running through the lands of Thomas Black and if unable to agree on price and obtain deed that the County Attorney is hereby authorized and instructed to prepare papers and do all necessary legal work in the condemnation for a R. O. W. 50 feet in width for a County road along a line the description to be furnished by the County Engineer.

Ordered that the County Engineer employ a plumber to install water pump, motor and automatic switch, wiring for switch, set water heater, furnish all pipe, etc., and that Alms House and that upon completion the Judge of Probate is hereby authorized to issue warrant in payment for same.

Ordered that the Commissioners, Taylor, Arnett and Balch make an inspection of and report on the advisability of granting a public road along the section line extending North from the North end of the Rucker Road to Upper Elkton Road.

Ordered that Geo. Christensen be employed to operate and have charge of Stewart's Ferry on Elk River. That he be paid \$1.00 per day for such from sun rise to sunset and all fees for rest of day and night to be his individually. He to take charge at once and to be employed subject to the pleasure of this court.

Court met pursuant to adjournment on Monday it being the 30 day of Sept. 1929. There was present and presiding the Hon. A. M. McDonnell, Judge of Probate and Ex Officio Chairman of said Court, also Wallace Coleman, Russell Balch, E. M. Taylor and W. G. Arnett, Commissioners.

The following proceedings were had and done to-wit:

Ordered that the County Engineer be authorized to make payment in full of payroll to J. E. Johnston for hauling gravel for the South end of the Somers Road in Beat # 1 and that that he be paid the sum of \$246.00 and to be the final payment in full for all graveling on said road done under his supervision to date.

Ordered that the County Engineer be authorized to pay one-half of the cost of the construction of two wooden bridges on the County Line Road near Crutcher's Spring.

Ordered that the County Engineer move the graveling trucks as soon as the Elkmont Road is completed to the pavement in Athens and to the Somers Road and that the Somers Road be completed and the Brown's Ferry Road to the three mile post or such distance as is most economical before any other roads are graveled.

Ordered that the County Engineer be authorized to trade in the present Dodge Sedan now used in his department for a Chevrolet Coach.

Ordered that the County Engineer be authorized to employ an auditor to audit the gasoline sales made in Limestone County from August 1st, 1928 to date.

Ordered that \$3,000.00 be transferred from the Inferior Court to the General Fund.

Ordered that Fred Wall, Attorney, be allowed a sum of \$760.00 out of the General Fund in addition to all other sums paid and agreed as for legal work and attorney's fees and cost in the case of Standard Oil Company vs Limestone County, Alabama for this Court for the year of March 15, 1929 to March 15th, 1930.

This being the day set for selecting a depository for the funds of Limestone County, the following bids were received:

The Farmers and Merchants Bank offered a bid of 4-3/5% and the Limestone County Bank bid 4-1/4%.

The Limestone County Bank's bid being the best, it was ordered, adjudged and decreed by the Court that it be accepted as follows:

The Limestone County Bank of Athens, Alabama, having offered for daily balances for Bank Deposits interest to be computed semi-annually at 4 1/4% and it appearing to the Court that the Limestone County Bank of Athens, Alabama be, and the same is hereby designated as the Depository for the Funds of Limestone County upon it giving Bond for the sum of \$50,000.00 Fifty Thousand Dollars with proper securities for the year 1930.

Ordered that A. M. McConnell, Judge of Probate, be authorized to sign the following contract with J. M. Smith as Supt. of County Alms House:

THE STATE OF ALABAMA) (THIS INDENTURE, Made and entered into on this the 18th day of Limestone County) (December, 1929, by and between the undersigned, A. M. McConnell, as Probate Judge of said County, who has been duly authorized by the Commissioners' Court to execute this contract in the name of and on behalf of the Commissioners' Court of Limestone County, Alabama, for Limestone County, Alabama, party of the first part, and J. M. Smith, party of the second part, WITNESSETH:

That party of the first part has agreed to lease unto the said party of the second part the property described as follows:

All of the land and tenements which belong to the County of Limestone, State of Alabama, about two miles from the City of Athens, Alabama, located on the Upper Elkton Road, and known as the Poor House or Mercy Home of said County.

To be used and occupied by J. M. Smith for the purpose of providing a fit and suitable home for the poor of said county.

But, it is hereby expressly provided, agreed, understood and stipulated by and between the parties hereto that this contract may be terminated by the Commissioners' Court on ten days written notice to the said J. M. Smith in the event that in the opinion of the Commissioners' Court the said J. M. Smith is not complying with the terms and stipulations herein set out.

It is further understood and agreed that in the event this contract is terminated by the Commissioners' Court while a crop is being grown or harvested that the said J. M. Smith or his tenants, shall be permitted to continue the cultivation and harvest of the same and pay a reasonable rental therefore but that J. M. Smith or his tenants, shall surrender, possession of all houses and buildings in case of the termination of this contract as herein provided.

This lease contract to commence on the 1st day of January, 1930, and to terminate on the 1st day of January, 1931.

The said party of the second part agrees to take said property for the term above stated on the following terms, stipulations and mutual agreements by and between said party

of the second part and the County of Limestone, State of Alabama, subject, however, to the foregoing stipulations and agreements.

Party of the second part agrees to take charge of said County Farm, to cultivate all the same and to keep up all repairs incident to the work on said houses, barns and fences to protect the property from all trespassers, and to allow nothing whatever to be moved or carried off the farm without the consent of the Commissioners' Court; and the said party of the second part agrees to feed all paupers coming to said premises of the County of Limestone, and in case of the death of an inmate the Superintendent will immediately report the same to the Judge of Probate, or, in his absence, to one of the Commissioners. The party of the second part agrees to take care of all the paupers coming unto said Poor House, to treat them with kindness, to keep the premises and abode of said paupers in a sanitary and wholesome manner, and agrees to feed the same wholesome food, as is in the opinion of the Commissioners' Court and County Board of Health necessary to sustain them properly. In case of illness of the inmates the Superintendent will do such nursing as can be done by inexperienced nurses, and when such cannot with safety handle the situation to call the attention of the County Health Officer and Judge of Probate at once. The Superintendent will either in person or by hired labor have the rooms, halls, etc, of all buildings used by the inmates scrubbed and put in a clean sanitary condition on every Monday and Friday morning, and also do such disinfecting as is necessary. He will also have a man to assist and see that each male inmate has a thorough bath on every Saturday afternoon. He will also have a woman to assist and see that all female inmates have a bath on every Saturday afternoon. He will see that all inmates have a sufficient amount of clothing for the necessary changes for proper sanitation, as well as good and sufficient bedding and cover. The Superintendent will be required to furnish a written report monthly showing the number of inmates, the exact day of arrival and leaving of each inmate. The items that are needed for the inmates, the Judge of Probate will receive proposals from dealers on articles needed, and a majority of the Commissioners will make purchase of same subject to the satisfaction at their next meeting.

The County of Limestone agrees to furnish all medical attention and clothing for said paupers, and to do all necessary improvements other than ordinary wear and tear, and to furnish all disinfectants that the Court may think necessary for the health of the inmates and the sanitary condition of the premises, all ordinary wear and tear to be done by the party of the second part. The said County of Limestone agrees to pay \$9.00 per month for each inmate in said Poor House, together with the rent of the Farm. For the above and such other services as the Commissioners' Court may deem necessary for the inmates' welfare, the County agrees to furnish the use of the County Mercy Home Farm, containing approximately 140 acres; the timber for use as fuel for the farm the buildings thereon; and for the use of the inmates, clothing, bedding, drugs, tobacco and snuff. The County agrees to pay for the laundrying of the inmates' wearing apparel and bed clothes and reserves the right to contract for said laundrying.

The party of the second part agrees to cultivate all tillable land on said place, but it is understood and agreed that said land shall be cultivated under the direction of the Commissioners of said County of Limestone.

Said party of the second part agrees to take good care of the premises above described, and to keep the same in a sanitary condition, all bedding, furniture and rooms clean and free from vermin, all bedding, furniture, etc. furnished by the County to be erected and changed upon the order of the Commissioners' Court of said County, and to surrender the same at the expiration of the term of this contract in good condition.

In the event said party of the second part fails to keep and perform any covenant or

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agreement contained herein, the Commissioners' Court of Limestone County shall be authorized and empowered to terminate this contract forthwith and demand possession of the premises.

WHEREAS, Section 1 of an Act of the Legislature approved ...1915 (Gen. Acts 1915, page) provides that the Board of Revenue or Court of County Commissioners has the power and authority to do all things needful and necessary in and about the construction and maintenance of public roads, and, said Section having been construed by the Court of Appeals of Alabama, in the case of Rogers Vs. Henry 97 So. 427 to the effect that the Board had power to pay all expenses necessary to obtaining information that may serve to better qualify Boards to intelligently study said road matters, and,

WHEREAS, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Revenue of Limestone County, Alabama, that each of the members of this Board be and they are hereby authorized to go to Montgomery, Alabama, to inspect such roads as will better enable them to serve said County and to file their expense account with this Board for payment; said expense to be the needful and necessary expenses incident to said trip.

Be it resolved that the Chairman and members of this Court attend the meeting or convention of the County Commissioners of Alabama, to be held at Montgomery on June 25th, and 26th. On vote, there were four ayes and no nays

It is ordered that the tractor and grader outfit now working in beat # 5 be moved to a point on the Good Springs Road West of Sugar Creek at a persimmon tree in beat # 6 and construct a grade from that point in a Northwest direction by the way of Robert's Mill and Union Hill School-house to the County line as soon as said outfit shall have finished the roads, it is not working on in beat # 5.

It is ordered that the County Engineer issue a warrant on the Road & Bridge fund in favor of Ross Sweetland for payment in full for a certain R. O. W. through his land near Piney Creek on the State Highway and what is locally known as the Athens-Huntsville Road.

Borrowing of
\$15,000.00

Whereas, in the judgment of the members of the Board of Commissioners of Limestone County, Alabama, it is necessary advisable and to the best interest of the citizens and tax payers of Limestone County, Alabama, that said court make a temporary loan in anticipation of the collection of taxes for the current year, the proceeds of which are needed for the purpose of meeting the necessary and current, running and operating expenses of Limestone County.

Therefore be it resolved that this court does hereby authorize the borrowing of the sum of \$15,000.00 to bear interest at the rate of 6 per cent per annum, evidenced by warrants, principal and interest of which is to be due and payable February 1, 1931.

Be it further resolved that Ward, Sterne & Company of Birmingham, Alabama, be and they are hereby authorized to negotiate a loan of \$15,000.00 for Limestone County Board of Commissioners and that said Company be paid \$150.00 for their services, provided said loan is consummated, said loan to be evidenced by tax anticipation Certificates of the Board of Commissioners of Limestone County, Alabama, due February 1, 1931, which said certificates are to be secured by a pledge of a sufficient amount of the current year's taxes, and to bear interest at the rate of 6 per cent per annum payable at maturity and are to be in such denominations as may be suitable to the purchasers.

Be it further resolved that the Probate Judge of Limestone County, Alabama, is hereby authorized and directed to prepare the warrants evidencing said loan and to sign the same on behalf of this court and to deliver the same to the purchasers as furnished by the said Ward, Sterne & Company, of Birmingham, Alabama, upon the payment of the face amount of said Warrants.

Be it further resolved that there is hereby pledged a sufficient amount of the current year's taxes to pay both principal and interest of said warrants, and it is further ordered that the county depository shall set aside and apart a sufficient amount of the current year's taxes when collected for the sole and exclusive purpose of paying principal and interest of said warrants held by the purchasers of said warrants and those to whom said warrants may be assigned, and it is hereby recited that this Board has investigated and found that the amount to be borrowed on said warrants is not a sum greater than one half of the income from taxation of Limestone County, for the preceding year and that said warrants are within every debt and other limitations prescribed by the Constitution of the State of Alabama.

Bureau of Public Roads in and over certain lands hereinafter described, for the benefit of the public and the public road purposes of Limestone County, Ala.,

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Commissioners Court that it is necessary for the use of Limestone County and the public thereof that a R. O. W. or an easement be acquired for the use of the public and for Limestone County for said road in said County over, along and across the lands hereinafter described owned by the parties herein and after named; land owned by E. E. Carruth as follows:



In the Matter of the request of City Board of Education of Athens, Limestone County, Alabama, for a Special Election to Determine Whether or not a Special Tax of 30 cents on each one hundred (\$100.00) Dollars of Taxable Property, shall be levied for School purposes.

A request in writing having been duly filed with, and presented to, the court of County Commissioners, of Limestone County, Alabama, on the 25 day of November, 1930, signed by City Board of Education of Athens, Alabama, by W. W. Malone as its President and J. M. Mr. Russell Balch introduced the following resolution and moved its adoption:

in gold coin of the United States of America of the present standard of weight and fineness, on the 1st day of February, 1931 at the banking house of the County Depository in Athens, Alabama, together with interest thereon in like gold coin at the same place, at the rate of six per centum per annum, payable on the 1st day of February, 1931; and the said County Depository is hereby ordered and directed to pay accordingly.

This certificate is issued under and pursuant to the Constitution and Laws of the State of Alabama, and particularly an Act of the Legislature of said state entitled "An act to authorize the courts of county commissioners, boards of revenue, or other governing bodies of counties in this State, to make temporary loans in anticipation of the collection of taxes," approved March 1, 1915, being Sections 239 to 243 inclusive of Article 10 of Chapter 16 of the Code of Alabama, 1923, and is issued for money loaned to said County in anticipation of the collection of taxes for the year 1930, and this certificate and the other certificates of the same date and tenor aggregating the sum of \$15,000.00 are issued covering such loan, and there is hereby pledged and appropriated such amount of the uncollected taxes of the current year 1930 as shall be sufficient fully to secure the repayment of such loan and the interest thereon as and when the same respectively become due and payable, and the county Depository is ordered and directed to set aside and hold apart from the other funds of the County a sufficient amount of such taxes to pay at maturity the principal of this certificate and the interest thereon.

It is hereby certified, recited and declared that all acts, conditions and things required to exist, to happen and to be performed precedent to and in the issuance of this certificate, exist, have happened and have been performed in due time, form and manner as required by law; that the amount of said loan aggregating \$15,000.00, together with all other loans made by said board in anticipation of the collection of taxes for the year 1930 is for a sum not greater than one-half the income of said County for the preceding year, 1929, and that no other loan or loans in anticipation of the collection of taxes for the year 1930 except outstanding tax anticipation loans of \$25,000.00 have been made for and in behalf of the said County of Limestone, and that the amount of this certificate together with every other debt of Limestone County is within every debt or other limit prescribed by the Constitution and Laws of the State of Alabama.

McConnell, *As Probate Judge of said County*, who has been duly authorized by the Commissioners' Court to execute this contract in the name of and on behalf of the Commissioners' Court of Limestone County, Alabama, for Limestone County, Alabama, party of the first part, and J. M. Smith, party of the second part, WITNESSETH:

That party of the first part has agreed to lease unto the said party of the second part the property described as follows:-

All of the land and tenements which belong to the County of Limestone, State of Alabama, about two miles from the City of Athens, Alabama, located on the Upper Elkton Road, and known as the Poor House or Mercy Home of said County.

To be used and occupied by J. M. Smith for the purpose of providing a fit and suitable home for the poor of said county.

But, it is hereby expressly provided, agreed, understood and stipulated by and between the parties hereto that this contract may be terminated by the Commissioners' Court on ten days written notice to the said J. M. Smith in the event that in the opinion of the Commissioners' Court the said J. M. Smith is not complying with the terms and stipulations herein set out.

It is further understood and agreed that in the event this contract is terminated by the Commissioners' Court while a crop is being grown or harvested that the said J. M. Smith, or his tenants, shall be permitted to continue the cultivation and harvest of the same and pay a reasonable rental therefor, but that said J. M. Smith, or his tenants, shall surrender possession of all houses and buildings in case of the

termination of this contract as herein provided.

This lease contract to commence on the 1st day of January, 1930, and to terminate on the 1st day of January, 1931.

The said party of the second part agrees to take said property for the term above stated on the following terms, stipulations and mutual agreements by and between said party of the second part and the County of Limestone, State of Alabama, subject, however, to the foregoing stipulations and agreements.

Party of the second part agrees to take charge of said County Farm, to cultivate all the same and to keep up all repairs incident to the work on said houses, barns and fences; to protect the property from all trespassers, and to allow nothing whatever to be moved or carried off the farm without the consent of the Commissioners' Court; and the said party of the second part agrees to feed all paupers coming to said premises of the County of Limestone, and in case of the death of an inmate the Superintendent will immediately report the same to the Judge of Probate, or, in his absence, to one of the Commissioners. The party of the second part agrees to take care of all the paupers coming into said Poor House, to treat them with kindness, to keep the premises and abode of said paupers in a sanitary and wholesome manner, and agrees to feed the same wholesome food, as is in the opinion of the Commissioners' Court and County Board of Health necessary to sustain them properly. In case of illness of the inmates the Superintendent will do such nursing as can be done by inexperienced nurses, and when such cannot with safety handle the situation to call the attention of the County Health Officer and Judge of Probate at once. The Superintendent will either in person or by hired labor have the rooms, halls, etc., of all buildings used by the inmates scrubbed and put in a clean sanitary condition on every Monday and Friday morning, and also do such disinfection

as is necessary. He will also have a man to assist and see that each male inmate has a thorough bath on every Saturday afternoon. He will also have a woman to assist and see that all female inmates have a bath on every Saturday afternoon. He will see that all inmates have a sufficient amount of clothing for the necessary changes for proper sanitation, as well as good and sufficient bedding and cover. The Superintendent will be required to furnish a written report monthly showing the number of inmates, the exact day of arrival and leaving of each inmate. The items that are needed for the inmates, the Judge of Probate will receive proposals from dealers on articles needed, and a majority of the Commissioners will make purchase of same subject to its satisfaction at their next meeting.

The County of Limestone agrees to furnish all medical attention and clothing for said paupers, and to do all necessary improvements other than ordinary wear and tear, and to furnish all disinfectants that the Court may think necessary for the health of the inmates and the sanitary condition of the premises, all ordinary wear and tear to be done by the party of the second part. The said County of Limestone agrees to pay \$9.00 per month for each inmate in said Poor House, together with the rent of the Farm. For the above and such other service as the Commissioners' Court may deem necessary for the inmates' welfare, the County agrees to furnish the use of the County Mercy Home Farm, containing approximately 140 acres; the timber for use as fuel for the farm, the buildings thereon; and for the use of the inmates, clothing, bedding, drugs, tobacco and snuff. The County agrees to pay for the laundrying of the inmates' wearing apparel and bed clothes, and reserves the right to contract for said laundrying.

The party of the second part agrees to cultivate all tillable land on said place, but it is understood and agreed that said land shall be cultivated under the direction of the Commissioners of said County of Limestone.

Said party of the second part agrees to take good care of the premises above described, and to keep the same in a

sanitary condition, all bedding, furniture and rooms clean and free from vermin,- all bedding, furniture, etc. furnished by the County to be erected and changed upon the order of the Commissioners' Court of said County, and to surrender the same at the expiration of the term of this contract in good condition.

In the event said party of the second part fails keep and perform any covenant or agreement contained herein, the Commissioners of Limestone County³ shall be authorized and empowered to terminate this contract forthwith and demand possession of the premises.

It is ordered that a section of the Mooresville-Ft. Hampton Road from the East line of section 23, Township 3, Range 6 to the West line of section 23 be graded at such a time as can be with due consideration to projects previously authorized.

It is ordered that the County Engineer employ J. E. Johnson ~~at the~~ et als to surface with gravel the South end of the Summers Road in Beat #1 upon the conditions that one-half of the cost be paid by the County and one-half borne by the interested citizens.

It is ordered that the County Tax Assessor be authorized to reduce the assessed valuation of the Dr. Isom Legg on a certain farm owned by him in Slough Beat and in the Beulah Land Community and that the said tax assessor is hereby authorized to credit the difference in such assessment as an error.

ORDER OF COURT OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS

In the Matter of the request of City Board of Education of Athens, Limestone County, Alabama, for a Special Election to Determine Whether or Not a Special Tax of 30 cents on each one hundred (\$100.00) Dollars of Taxable Property, Shall Be Levied for School Purposes.

A request in writing having been duly filed with, and presented to, the Court of County Commissioners, of Limestone County, Alabama, on the 25 day of November, 1930, signed by City Board of Education of Athens, Alabama, by W. W. Malone as its President and J. M. Whereas, in the judgment of the members of the Board of Commissioners of Limestone County, Alabama, it is necessary, advisable and to the best interest of the citizens and tax payers of Limestone County, Alabama, that said court make a temporary loan in anticipation of the collection of taxes for the current year, the proceeds of which are needed for the purpose of meeting the necessary and current, running and operating expenses of Limestone County.

Therefore be it resolved that this court does hereby authorize the borrowing of the sum of \$15,000.00 to bear interest at the rate of 6 per centum per annum, evidenced by warrants, principal and interest of which is to be due and payable February 1, 1931.

Be it further resolved that Ward, Sterne & Company of Birmingham, Alabama, be and they are hereby authorized to negotiate a loan of \$15,000.00 for Limestone County Board of Commissioners and that said Company be paid \$150.00 for their services, provided said loan is consummated, said loan to be evidenced by tax anticipation Certificates of the Board of Commissioners of Limestone County, Alabama, due February 1, 1931, which said certificates are to be secured by a pledge of a sufficient amount of the current year's taxes, and to bear interest at the rate of 6 per cent per annum payable at maturity and are to be in such denominations as may be suitable to the purchasers.

Be it further resolved that the Probate Judge of Limestone County, Alabama, is hereby authorized and directed to prepare the warrants evidencing said loan and to sign the same on behalf of this court and to deliver the same to the purchasers as furnished by the said Ward, Sterne & Company of Birmingham, Alabama, upon the payment of the face amount of said warrants.

Be it further resolved that there is hereby pledged a sufficient amount of the current year's taxes to pay both principal and interest of said warrants, and it is further ordered that the county depository shall set aside and apart a sufficient amount of the current year's taxes when collected for the

sole and exclusive purpose of paying principal and interest of said warrants held by the purchasers of said warrants and those to whom said warrants may be assigned, and it is hereby recited that this Board has investigated and found that the amount to be borrowed on said warrants is not a sum greater than one half of the income from taxation of Limestone County, for the preceding year and that said warrants are within every debt and other limitations prescribed by the Constitution of the State of Alabama.

PRESENT: Hon. A. M. McConnell, Judge of Probate and Ex-Officio Chairman, presiding and Commissioners, W. G. Arnett, Russell Balch, E. M. Taylor and Will H. Beasley.

The following resolution was opened by Commissioner Taylor and seconded by Commissioner Arnett:

A. P. Henderson, County Engineer, be and is hereby instructed to replace the gravel surface of the Greenbriar and Rockhouse Road in Limestone County also, that the County Depository be and is hereby instructed to pay the warrants drawn, for such maintenance against the State Gas Tax, by the County Engineer and approved by the Judge of Probate.

(Copy of resolution of loan for \$15,000)

WHEREAS is necessary for the County to acquire certain R.O.W. or an easement, as requested by the State Highway Department of Alabama and the U.S. Bureau of Public Roads in and over certain lands hereinafter described, for the benefit of the public and the public road purposes of Limestone County, Ala.,

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Commissioners Court that it is necessary for the use of Limestone County and the public thereof that a R.O.W. or an easement be acquired for the use of the public and for Limestone County for said road in said County over, along and across the lands hereinafter described owned by the parties herein and after named; land owned by E. E. CARRUTH as follows:
