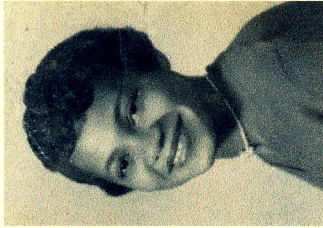

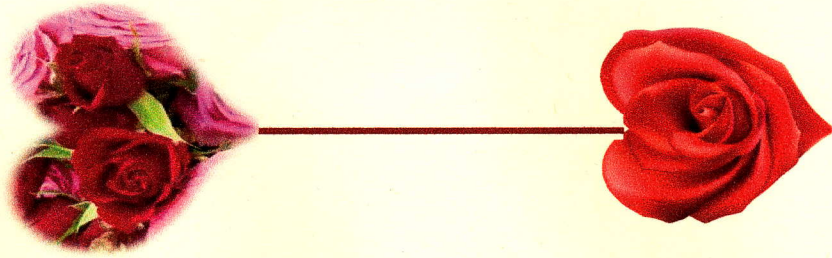

OVARIAN CANCER

Ovarian Cancer is a cancer that starts in the ovaries and is the fifth most common cancer among women. Symptoms of ovarian cancer are often vague. Women and their doctors often blame the symptoms on other more common conditions. By the time the cancer is diagnosed, the tumor has often spread beyond the ovaries.

BRCA1 and BRCA2 are human genes that belong to a class of genes known as tumor suppressors. Mutation of these genes has been linked to hereditary breast and ovarian cancer. Women with a personal history of breast cancer or a family history of breast or ovarian cancer have an increased risk for ovarian cancer. Thus, ask your doctor for the BRCA1 and BRCA2 mutation testing. It is not part of an annual exam. CA 125 Blood Testing is a commonly used tumor marker but it is not perfect. Please talk to your doctor and request this testing if necessary.
