Dear Harry:


After the tumult and the shouting dies, I wish you would get Governor Miller to turn my negro, Rosavelt Fletcher, loose.

The Pardoning Board has recommended his parole, which the enclosed copy of a letter from Mr. Jarman shows.

The parole was recommended by all the white people in Rosavelt's community, by practically all the officials, including Judge Horton. The Pardoning Board at first declined and afterward rescinded their action.

Stay with them.
