God wants me now . . .*

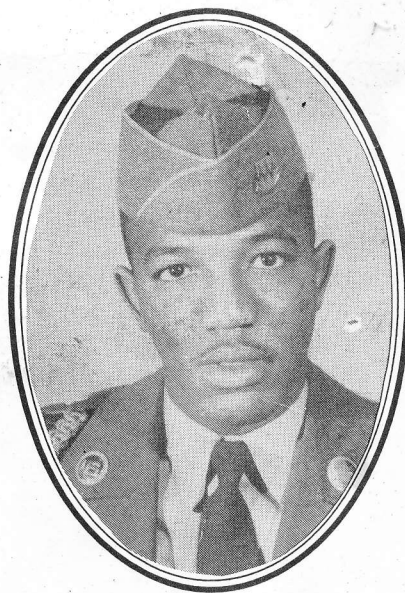

# Obsequies

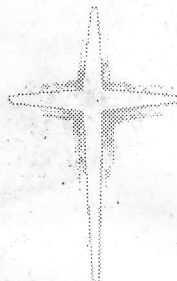
