OBITUARY

Leonard "James" Farrar, Jr., was born August 17, 1923 in West Limestone County to the late Leonard Farrar Sr. and Lillie Phelps Farrar. He was the second born of eight children.

He attended Poplar Creek School and Miller public school.

Leonard confessed hope in Christ at an early age and joined Freewill Baptist Church under the Pastorate of Rev. R. B. Watkins. After relocating to Louisville, KY, he united with Guiding Star Missionary Baptist Church. Later he returned to Athens and united with St. Paul M. B. Church where he remained a faithful member until his health failed. He served many years on the Deacon Board at St. Paul.

He was drafted into the military during World War II and served a lengthy tour in the European theatre. Leonard was a kind and gentle person, never involved in fights or quarrels with others. The United States Army awarded him a good conduct medal and three bronze stars for outstanding service to the U. S. Army in France, Germany, and the Middle East theatre operations.

He was married to the late Sally Jenkins of Tanner, AL for 46 years; who preceded him in death. No children were born to this union.

Leonard was employed at American Standards Corp. during his stay in Louisville, KY.

He leaves to cherish fond memories three devoted sisters; Deloris Jefferson, Athens, AL; Lillie Scott, Ocala, FL; Daisy (William) Baity, New Albany, IN and three devoted brothers, Floyd A. Farrar, Winston Farrar and David L. Farrar, all of Athens, AL; Amos D. Farrar, preceded him in death. He also leaves to cherish his memories seven nieces, five nephews, cousins, and friends.
