Dear Judge Roulac:

I am sure Mr. Leonard has already told you of my phone conversation with Mr. Lienthal yesterday afternoon.

I have just received the following wire from him relative to same:

"No final decision will be made on organization matter or on change on personnel until investigation in the field which I have just initiated has been made stop appreciate your talking to coordinator John Blandford who will come to the Shoals later this week."

I am writing Mr. Blandford asking him the date he will be at the Shoals and advising him that I will be in Athens Saturday. Of course, if it is necessary I can come earlier. However, before I talk with Mr. Blandford I am quite anxious to have all of the information about the parties whom we discussed yesterday. I would also like to have copy of your letter to the Authority. While Mr. Lienthal said nothing about Mr. Blandford discussing this matter with you I am sure he will on his visit to the Shoals, and if he does I would like to get your reaction to his conversation before I talk with him.

Mr. Lienthal was extremely courteous on the phone yesterday and thanked me very much for the interest I have taken in the matter. He stated that the only way they had of getting in touch with the inside facts was through disinterested friends.
