Dear Sir:-

With reference to your mortgage to me, as guardian, and the amount of past due interest thereon, all the records of payments that I had were destroyed on January 24th. The only thing that I have to go by is the records of Limestone County Bank where I made deposits of the amounts paid by you.

These records of deposits which could and evidently were payments made by you are as follows:

Jan. 23, 1934, \$100.00; March (or May I cannot tell which from the writing), 16, 1934, \$100.00; July 3, 1934, \$50.00; Nov. 13, 1934, \$50.00.

These dates may not be the dates of your checks or receipts but they represent the dates of the deposits of the payments made by you and may have been the same day or the next day or the next week after the payments were made.

Please check these up with your records and receipts or cancelled checks and if there is any discrepancy lets get it straightened out now, and the balance of the past due interest I must insist upon being paid right way.
