Obituary

William "Toby" Coleman Jr. was born on July 19, 1941 in Decatur, Alabama to the late William and Edna Coleman, Sr. He passed this life on Friday, December 4, 2009 in Louisville, Kentucky. His brother, Norman Coleman preceded him in death.

He accepted Christ at a young age and joined the Macedonia C. P. Church under the leadership of Reverend Frank Moore. He attended Lakeside High School where he graduated in 1959. After graduation, he enlisted in the United States Army, where he was honorably discharged. Toby worked for the Lurleen B. Wallace Center after leaving the Army.

William was affectionately called "*Minnesota*", "*Fats*" and "*Bama*" by his friends. He later moved to Louisville, Kentucky and worked for the United Auto Workers. After moving back home to Decatur, he rejoined Macedonia C. P. Church in America under the leadership of Rev. Dr. G. Lynne Herring.

"Toby" moved back to Louisville, Kentucky two years ago, where he remained until his death.


