Obituary

Leroy Fuller was born on January 16, 1918 to the late Ruben and Laura Etta Fuller. He accepted Christ at an early age and was a member of the Bethlehem P. B. Church under the leadership of Reverend Willie Eddie Oles.

Mr. Fuller served in the United States Army from 1942-1945, where he received the World War II Victory Medal, the European African Middle Eastern Service Medal and two Bronze stars and the American Service Medal. After an honorable discharge from the army, he married the late Martha Fletcher and moved to Chattanooga, Tennessee.

Mr. Fuller returned to Huntsville, Alabama in 1997. He rededicated his life to Christ and joined the Pentecostal Lighthouse Church under the leadership of Bishop Johnny Burrell.

While still holding onto his faith in Christ, Mr. Fuller was called home to rest. He departed this life on June 25, 2000. He leaves to cherish his memories, a loving sister: Ms. Annie M. Fuller, two very devoted nieces: Mrs. Laura Etta Trawick (Connie) and Mrs. Annie Laura Jefferson, of Huntsville, Alabama and a host of other nieces, nephews, step-grandchildren, cousins and friends.
