Brief Sketch of Life

MR. CHARLES HENRY BROWN, SR., the son of the late William Edward and Mamie Lee McWilliams Brown, was born on March 23, 1931 in Limestone County, Elkmont, Alabama. Charles was the eleventh of thirteen children. Charles departed this life Friday, February 17, 2012. He was 80 years, 11 months on the day of his passing. He attended school at Elkmont Elementary and graduated from Trinity High School in Athens, Alabama graduating on May 23, 1950. After high school, Charles served in the United States Army during the Korean War with an honorably discharged in 1960.

CHARLES had a love for baseball. He pitched for the New ERA Giants in Alabama and briefly for the Negro Baseball National League with the Memphis Red Sox and the local Indianapolis Red Sox.

CHARLES retired from Chrysler after 33 years of devoted service and was a member of the Local UAW.

CHARLES was initiated in 1976 as a Master Mason of Fidelity Lodge No. 55 and Constantine Consistory No 25. **Charles** was an active member for over 35 year upon his death.


CHARLES leaves one surviving sibling, Ever Jean Clark of Seattle Washington. He leaves a host of nieces, nephews, cousins and cherished friends.
