


Barbara Ann Collier was born on December 18, 1943 in Athens, Alabama to John Robert Collier Sr. and Eunice Louise Benford Collier. She grew up in the Antioch Presbyterian Church and became a Christian while still in high school. Barbara graduated from Trinity High School and received her Bachelor Degree from Alabama A&M University in Business Education and English. She earned a Master's Degree in Biblical Counseling and a Doctorate Degree (PhD) in Christian Thought. She was also a Licensed Real Estate agent and a Licensed Private Airplane Pilot. She was the private pilot for Reverend, Dr. Gillette O. James at Beth Eden Baptist Church in Oakland, California.

After graduating from college, Barbara began her career with the Federal Government, Atomic Energy Commission in Oak Ridge, Tennessee. From there she continued with the Federal Government in Albuquerque, New Mexico, San Francisco, California, Washington, D.C., Oakland, California, and Atlanta, Georgia. She retired in 1999 after 34 1/2 years of service.

After retiring, Barbara utilized her doctorate degree in Christian Thought and Biblical Counseling by opening a Counseling Office at the Lawrence County Baptist Association and served as a Therapist with the Tennessee Baptist Convention. She also served as Professor of Counseling at the American University of Biblical Studies in Atlanta and as a volunteer on the Chaplain's staff at the Veterans Hospital in Nashville, Tennessee.

She counseled at the women's prison in Rockdale County, Georgia, the men's prison in Clifton, Tennessee and taught a session of Pastoral Counseling in Mexico.

Barbara retired to a 25-acre farm in Lawrenceburg, Tennessee where she raised beef cows, was a photographer, quilter, and lovingly hosted family and friends. She enjoyed giving dinner parties, traveling and gardening. Her favorite activity in retirement was quilting. Barbara traveled to 17 different countries throughout the world, including China, and traveled to 45 of the 50 states in the U. S. Her greatest joy was the friendship of her friends and family. God surely smiled on Barbara.

Barbara was an active member of the Deerfield Baptist Church in Lawrenceburg and most recently joined the Pleasant Grove C. P. Church in Athens, Alabama. She is survived by her husband Charlie Collier of Lawrenceburg, Tennessee; daughter Tracey Baker and son-in-law Nicky Baker of Flovilla, Georgia, two grandchildren, Ivana and Dion; her mother, Louise Collier; sisters Sherrye, Julia, Connie, Gloria, Valerie, Shelia, Carol, and Gina; brothers John and Jerauld; brothers-in-law, sisters-in-law, cousins, nieces, nephews, uncles, aunts, and friends.

She loved the Lord with all her heart and trusted him completely.
