Mrs. Rosa Perry Fields was born in Limestone County, Alabama, on August 7, 1895. She departed this life September 15, 1973, in Huntsville, Alabama. She was 78 years old.

She was a member of the Methodist Church for 61 years. Her home church, where she first joined, was Oakland Methodist, Harris, Alabama. In 1924 she moved to Huntsville, and transferred her membership to Lakeside Methodist Church.

She served in the Church as class leader, primary teacher in the Sunday School, and was for six years chairman of one of the Circles of the Women's Society of Christian Service. Sixteen years were also devoted to helping to serve the good people of Gadsden, Alabama at Sweet Home Methodist Church.

Mrs. Fields attended school in Decatur, Alabama, and later took a correspondence course in Nursing from Wayne School of Nursing. Her certificate was awarded in 1952.

Her young adult and later years were also devoted to her family, raising twelve children. She worked with the Parent-Teacher's Association at Councill High School for many years while they were in attendance there.

Rearing her children was a great joy. Presiding over their growth and development, in addition to keeping them going in the right direction were fulfilling responsibilities.

She leaves to cherish her memory her husband, Rev. L. G. Fields; five daughters, Mrs. Annie P. Gunnell and Mrs. Rosetta F. Merrill, St. Louis, Missouri; Mrs. Mary O.
