By this time I know you will have gotten my letter of Saturday, and I hope that you-all are not too "put-out" about it. Another thing I forgot to mention is the weather here, and how it affects my sinus. Being on a high bluff above the Mississippi, the wind blows continually and even though it may not be very cold I have a dull ache above my eyes and discharge a very nasty looking stuff when I blow my nose. I do not believe it is anything serious and that it will clear up when I get home. However, for the past two weeks it has been very annoying. Today, the wind is at its highest and I believe snow isn't far off.
