OBITUARY



MOTHER PAULINE MOORE CLEMONS was introduced to the late Henry and Alberta Moore on October 9, 1931 in Limestone County, Alabama. She was a happy child with sometimes great responsibilities when her mother became ill at an early age, being the oldest of two younger sisters (Mary Dean (deceased) and Mary Elizabeth). It was during these times that she learned to cook, and she began to master this skill very well. Mother Clemons had an older brother whom she loved dearly, Mr. Ponester Wiggins, who preceded her in death.

Mother Clemons attended the Limestone County Schools and was also a student at Pleasant Grove Church School. She confessed her love for Christ very early in life and became a member of the Pleasant Grove CPCA family. She married Elder John H. Clemons in 1952. Two children; Henry Alfred Moore (deceased) and Barbara J. Clemons were proud to call them parents.

Mother Clemons expressed her love for Christ in many ways. She was very sociable in that she opened her home and kitchen to whomever she wanted to share her love. Age was never a gap in the people she befriended. She was very serious about her love for others and shared her wisdom to help guide them in the right direction. She knew that God "never made nothing he couldn't rule". She taught Sunday School and would even feed her Youth Sunday School Class "Sunday morning breakfast". She was a song leader in the No. 1 Choir, Youth Advisor (helping to organize the first Youth Choir), she served on the Church Usher Board and Missionary Society in her home church and on the Presbyterial Synodical, and General Assembly levels.

Mother Clemons lived a life filled with love for others and was an active participant in many organizations and civic auxiliaries. Her love led her to adopt many sons and daughters of which she was proud to be a part of their lives. On Wednesday, April 16, 2014, God called her home to rest from all of her labor and she answered the call with a smile.
