Obituary

Charles Edward Moore, Sr., was born October 9, 1939 in Louisville, Kentucky to the late **Clarence and Rossetta Moore** who later moved to Chicago, Illinois.

He departed this life on January 13, 2003 at the age of 63.

When Charles moved to Madison, Alabama, he accepted faith in Christ and became a member of the Church of Christ. Brother Moore craved knowledge of the Holy Bible and he soon became a worker for the Lord. He began preaching at the Moulton Heights Church of Christ where he was known for preaching the sermon "Valley of the Dry Bones". He has since then continued to be strong and steadfast in the Lord.
