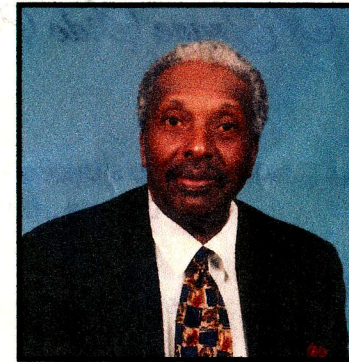

SAMUEL WILLIAM MILLER JUNIOR'S journey into this life was a blessing and gift from God to the late Samuel and Susie Fletcher Miller on July 13, 1931 in Limestone County, Alabama.

Samuel grew up in the New Hope Community, where his formal education was completed at the New Hope Junior High and Trinity high Schools. Later, he pursued his Bachelor's and Master's of Science from Tennessee State University. He completed further studies at the University of Illinois, Indiana State and Clark - Atlanta Universities.

His college days were his fondest memories. He was a supportive alumni of the "Blue and White", a member of the Omega Psi Phi Fraternity; a lifetime member of the National Educational Association. He was an educator in the Limestone School System for over 25 years, touching the lives of many students either in a disciplinary programs or the echo "stay in school and get your education".
