Dear Senator:--I have your letter of the 27th and would have replied to the same but for absence attending court. I appreciate the sentiments expressed in your letter and assure you that I reciprocate the good will, and will do anything that I can to cooperate with you when you are elected Speaker.

With reference to reapportionment, I have been thinking, as you know, a great deal about the proper solution of this question, and have about decided the best way under the present constitution is to let each county have one representative, 67 being the full membership of the house, and then have 22 senators, that being the amount allowed under the present constitution, when the membership in the House was reduced, and to divide these senatorships into equal ratio of population, giving to each one hundred and twenty thousand population one senator. What do you think of this?
