
I herewith hand you statement of account for one-half of retainer's fee in the matter of the matter of the Merrill Road Improvement Company case.

As stated to you a few days ago on the street, this retainer fee came to me, and was equally divided between Mr. Walker and myself. We did nothing on the case during his lifetime. At the dissolution of our partnership, Mr. Walker offered to repay the fifty dollars, being one-half of the retainer fee. I suggested at that time that he retain the fifty dollars, pending further developments in the case, with the understanding that when we went further into the matter, I would feel at liberty to ask his advice, and aid in prosecuting the case; that if nothing further came up in the matter within a reasonable time, he could turn the fifty dollars over to me.

As you will recall, you hold a due bill against me being part of purchase money on portable vault which Mr. Walker and I owned jointly, and whose share I purchased at the time of our dissolution.

When you pay the enclosed account of fifty dollars, I will endorse the check back to you, and you can give me credit on my due bill.
