I hurried and worried when active and strong,

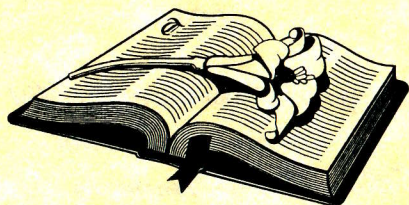
I needed the quiet, though at first I rebelled,

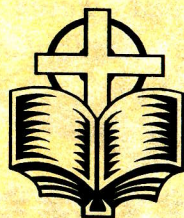
The time has come for us to part
