The following resolution was
unanimously adopted at an open air
rally to-night, which was called to
discuss the verdict of the jury at
Decatur, Alabama, in reference to the
Nine Scottsboro Boys.

" We, Three hundred and fifty,
(350) workers of Brighton Beach, Brooklyn,
New York, at an open air demonstration,
condemn the conviction of Mr. Haywood
Patterson, in the face of a complete
exposure of the frame-up nature of the
whole Scottsboro Case. This Legal Lynch
Justice may be attributed to the poisonous
Race Hatred atmosphere injected by the
prosecution, especially in reference to
"Jew Money" and the general "Southern

Attitude" towards the Negro People.

We demand the freedom of
Mr. Haywood Patterson and the rest
of the boys.

We demand a Change of Venue
to Birmingham, Alabama. "11"
