My dear Harry:-

I have yours of March 13.

Our lives are too closely interwoven and we have too much in common to quarrel, so let's not further discuss the Alabama Public Service Commission except for me to say that when Governor Talmadge of Georgia discovered that the Georgia Public Service Commission was unfaithful to the public trust he "fixed" them. This is my conception of public service. The record of the Alabama Public Service Commission is so vulnerable that were I Governor I would do what Talmadge did and were I a member of the Legislature I would introduce a Bill to have this office abolished.

My reference to politics playing a part in our political life was in no way intended to be personal. Speaking broadly, it is something that exists and will continue to exist so long as we have government to deal with
