

Reverend Willie Cameron was born to the late Lelia and John Cameron in Green County, Alabama. He confessed a hope in Christ at a very early age.

He was united in Holy Matrimony to the late Louida Hunter. To this union, one child, Eugene, who preceded him in death, was born. On September 12, 1952, Reverend Cameron united in Holy Matrimony with Ms. Helen Wood. To this union, two daughters were adopted.

Reverend Cameron was called into the ministry in 1945. He became the pastor of the Thankful Missionary Baptist Church of Middleboro, Kentucky. After pastoring the Thankful Baptist Church for four years, he became the pastor of the Friendship Missionary Baptist Church of Cumberland, Kentucky. After leaving Cumberland he moved to Limestone County. Reverend Cameron united with the Little Ezekiel Baptist Church under the leadership of Reverend Elmore Hurt.

In April 1967, Reverend Cameron became the Field Missionary for the Round Island Creek Association of Limestone County, Alabama. After serving diligently for three years as Field Missionary, he resigned to become the pastor of the St. Luke Missionary Baptist Church for thirteen years. Here at St. Luke, Reverend Cameron shall be missed in many ways. He was a great asset to the church and to the community.

He departed this life Wednesday, July 10, 1985, at the Limestone County Hospital, Athens, Alabama.

He leaves to cherish his memories, a loving and devoted wife, Ms. Helen Cameron; two lovely children, Tonya and Shannon; one sister, Ms. Gertrude Mitchell of Chester, Pennsylvania; one grand daughter, Ms. April Cameron of Tallahassee, Florida; one uncle, Mr. Efford Hicks of Bessemer, Alabama; one devoted sister-in-law, Ms. Esther Scott of Athens; and a host of nieces and nephews, relatives and friends.
