sweet mother should have.

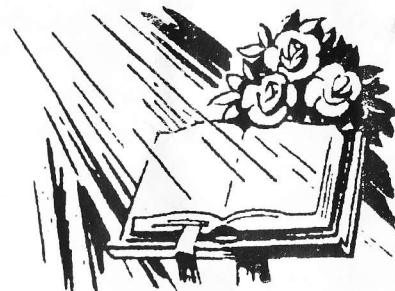
