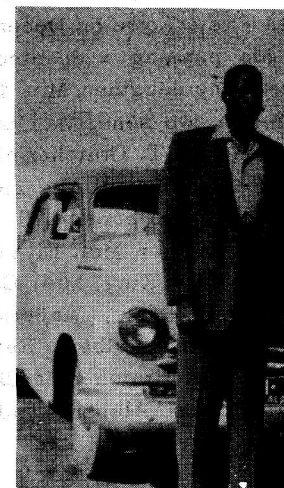

## OBITUARY
