Life Reflections

Mattie Jolly (Lewis) Brown, a native of Limestone County and referred to by many as "Honey", was born on January 28, 1926. She entered into everlasting peace on Saturday June 9, 2012.

She was the youngest daughter born to the late Jerry Jolly and Esther Robinson Jolly. Two brothers preceded her in death, Samuel and Henry Jolly. Mattie was united in holy matrimony to the late Timothy Lewis Jr. From that union ten children were born; three of whom preceded her in death: Mae Emma Lewis (1963); Roosevelt Lewis (2001); and Willie T. Lewis (2004).

Mattie confessed hope in Christ at an early age. She was baptized and joined New Hope C.P.C.A. of Madison, Alabama. While there she served in the church choir and the usher ministry. Mattie later relocated to Trinity, Alabama where she became an active member of the Trinity community. She became a faithful and diligent member of the Springhill Missionary Baptist Church and served on the Mother Board, Missionary Ministry, and Senior Choir. After relocating to the Decatur area she joined the St. James C.P.C.A. in Decatur, Alabama where she faithfully served with the Board of Mothers and Missionary Ministry. Mattie was a devoted member and maintained a deep love for her Church Family and her Pastor. After her health began to fail and she was unable to attend worship services, she cherished the visits from her beloved Church Family and Pastor. Mattie endured and stood firm on the Word of God. She enjoyed studying the Word and had a deep love for Bible Study and Sunday School.

Mattie was a Certified Nurse Technician for over 35 years at Baugh & Wiley Hospital and Parkway Medical Center. It was at Parkway Medical Center where she met a new love of her life, the late Madison Brown. She and Madison Brown were united in holy matrimony and devoted themselves to each other until Madison's death.

Mattie was a proud member and Worthy Matron of the National Grand Chapter Order of the Eastern Star No. 40 where she was committed as long as her health allowed.

Embarking under the umbrella of Eastern Star, she and eight close friends formulated their own club, "Eight is Enough" whereby the ladies would fellowship, share the Word of God and encourage each other, later adding on "The Prayer Band Ministry."

She partnered with Decatur Community Action where she shared her love and compassion with the children of the Boys and Girls Club and served as a foster grandparent working at the West Morgan and West Decatur Elementary Schools. Mattie embraced all who came into her presence and was always willing to give her testimony of the goodness of Jesus.

While a resident of the Decatur Health and Rehabilitation Center, Mattie was crowned "Mrs. Decatur Health and Rehabilitation Queen 2008, and inducted into the Decatur Red Hat Club as an Honorary Red Member in 2010.

On Saturday June 9, around 11:09 A.M., our Muh's statement to us was that of Timothy; "For I am now ready to be offered, and the time of my departure is at hand. I have fought a good fight, I have finished my course, I have kept the faith: Henceforth there is laid up for me a crown of righteousness which the Lord, the righteous judge, shall give me at that day; and not to me only, but unto all them that love his appearing." 2Timothy 4:6-8.

Mother Brown loved and cherished her family, often times bragging about all her children. She was a mother, grandmother, sister and friend.
