Dear Earnest:

Replying to yours of June 24 will say that the friends of reapportionment have been quite anxious to get a Bill through but have felt that it was better strategy to wait until the Governors Revenue Bill was out of the way. We hope to get that Revenue measure passed next week and when we come back after the recess Senator Stephens, Mr. Byars of Moulton, I and others who are interested in the matter expect to push a Bill through if humanly possible.

I hope to have a Bill completed by that time which will receive the endorsement of Governor Graves, the liberal minded members of the Black Belt, as well as the representatives of the White Section. I realize that if we can get the Governors aid the passage of the Bill will be assured.
