Ann Delois Fitzgerald, affectionately known as “Anndelois” was born 2 July 1937 to the parentage of Henry Lewis Fitzgerald and Donella Allen. She departed this life on Tuesday, 21 February 2012, at the Decatur General Hospital. She was preceded in death by her parents, her husband, John Henry Reed, Jr., her son Larry Bernard Reed and grandson, Savelas Reed.

Ann Delois married John Henry Reed and to this union, they welcomed the following children to their family: Michael Jonathan Reed, Charlotte Augusta Reed, Paula Germaine Reed, John Henry Reed, III, and Larry Bernard Reed.

Her Christian Journey began at King’s Memorial United Methodist Church where she confessed her hope in Christ when The Rev. Eugene H. Leeth was the pastor.
