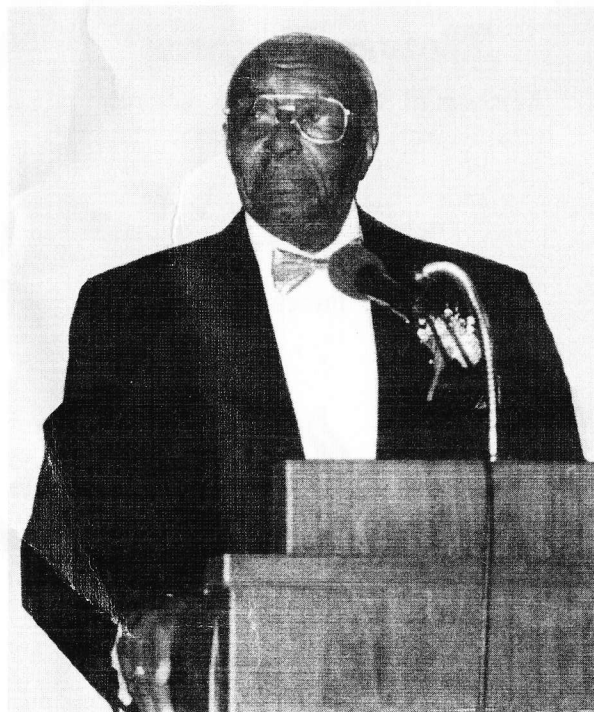
Obituary

Elder William Amos Donaldson, Sr. was born on July 15, 1915 in Madison County, Alabama, to the late Elder Eddie and Carrie (Battle) Donaldson. He departed this life on April 10, 2001 in Huntsville, Alabama.

Elder Donaldson was united in Holy Matrimony to the late Mary Ellen Ford. To this union, two sons were born -- the late William Amos Donaldson, Jr. and the late Robert Edward Donaldson. On October 15, 1939, he was united in Holy Matrimony to the late Addie Lee Toney. This union was blessed with fifteen children.

Elder Donaldson was affiliated with the St. James P. B. Church during his entire ministry. He also served as the Pastor of St. Mark P. B. Church for 33 years. He preached his first sermon of September 5, 1943 and was ordained on March 18, 1944. A few months later (August 6, 1944), Reverend S. Hereford, the Pastor of St. James P. B. Church became ill and Reverend Donaldson was asked to take charge of the service for him. Subsequently, he was elected Pastor of the church on November 24, 1944 and served for over 50 years.
