Dear Memaw

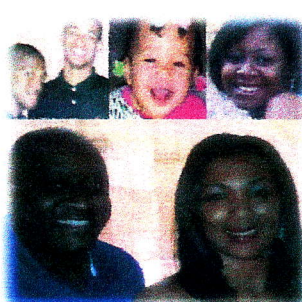
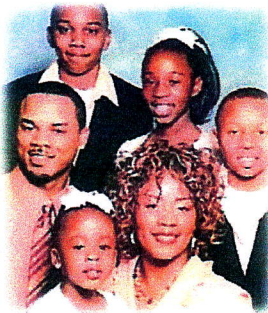

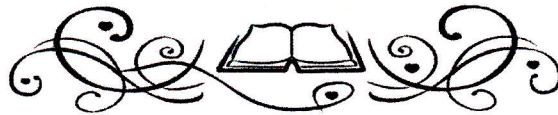
## *Miss Me, But Let Me Go*
