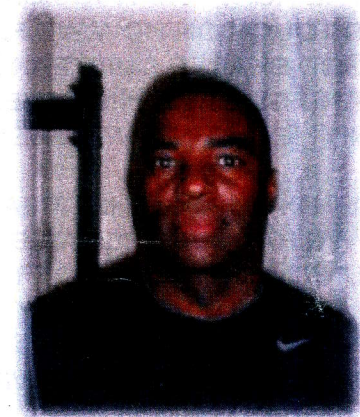

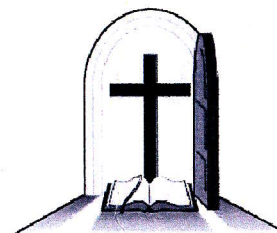

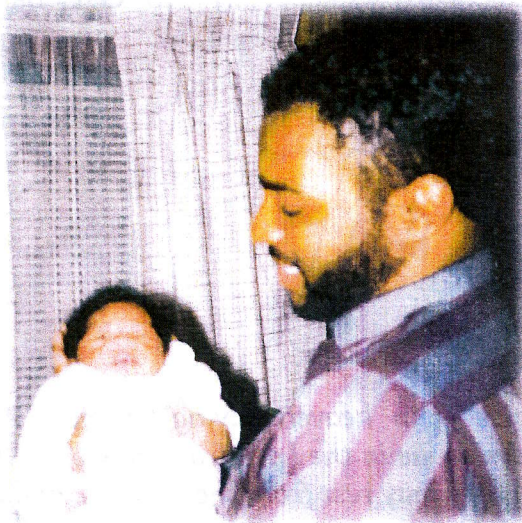

Obituary

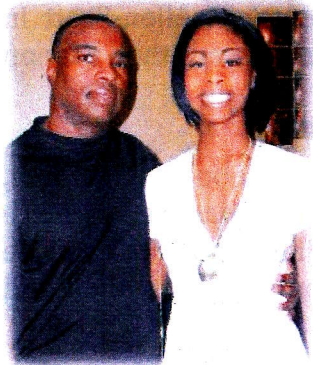

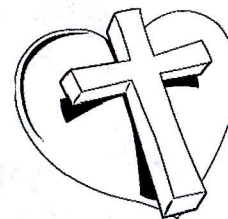
