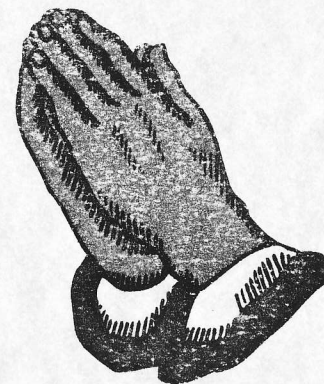

## Obituary

Deacon Wendell Farrar was born June 12, 1920, to the late George and Callie Mae Farrar of Limestone County. He departed this life on Sunday, June 3, 2001, at the Athens Limestone Hospital, Athens, Alabama. He confessed hope in Jesus Christ at an early age at St. Paul Missionary Baptist Church under the leadership of the Reverend A.D. Booker and later joined the David's Temple Missionary Baptist Church, where he remained a faithful member until death. Deacon Farrar served as: Chairman of the Deacon Board, Superintendent of the Sunday School, member of the Brotherhood and member of the Trustee Board. Deacon Farrar was a fervent supporter of The Round Island Creek Missionary Baptist Association for over 50 years and during that time he served in many different offices.

Deacon Farrar retired from the Alabama Farmer's Co-op in 1982 and later retired from Swanner's Contractors. He worked with the Limestone County Voters League for several years.

He united in Holy Matrimony to the late Bernice Davis Farrar on December 24, 1941, who preceded him in death on November 3, 1999. Twelve children were born to this union (one preceded them in death, Vernie Farrar). He leaves 11 children to cherish his memories: Five daughters; Lou Jean Hines of Athens, AL; Marie Hines (Milton), Lallie Rae Lucas (Adam), Sharon McLin (Milton), Myrtle Mull (Kevin), all of Tanner, Alabama; six sons: Richard Farrar, Dwight Farrar (Margaret), Levon Farrar, Donnell Farrar, Maverick Farrar, and Macon Farrar all of Tanner, Alabama; 26 grandchildren, 7 step-grandchildren, 14 great-grandchildren, 5 step-great-grandchildren; 1 brother, Reverend George H. Farrar (Rosie-Lee) of Indianapolis, Indiana; 2 sister-in-laws, Marie Peoples of Cleveland, Ohio, and Clara Shoulders of Tanner, Alabama; 2 brother-in-laws, Tommy Carthen, of Tanner Alabama and Charles Shoulders of Athens, Alabama; a host of nieces, nephews, other relatives and friends.
