The Tennessee Valley Authority has between 500 and 700 cords of wood on the fertilizer plant reservation at Muscle Shoals, which it wishes to sell.

For the most part this wood consists of cut lengths of old chestnut trees, which the blight has killed and which, as a protection to new trees now being planted, have had to be removed. A good deal of it is piled along the roadways. The rest is in stumpage and scattered about the reservation.

John L. Neely Jr., manager of the Muscle Shoals properties, has advertised for bids for this wood, and interested parties will have until May 10th to submit their proposals. The bids are to be based on the cord as a unit. They should be accompanied by cash or a certified check for twenty per cent of the amount of the bid. Payment is to be completed within ten days of the award.
