## Resolutions of Dale County Teachers

Whereas our schools have suffered from numberless handicaps during the depression while we as teachers have sacrificed by accepting cuts in salaries, teaching in the face of many uncertainties, and in some instances giving free service, and whereas employees of both State and county governments have continued to receive their salaries promptly, we as teachers of Dale County assembled hereby appeal to the Governor and Legislature to exhaust every possible means to bring about the following readjustments which are due to our profession, the children of the State, and to our citizenship at large.

First, That they provide immediately for the continuation of our schools for a full term this year without further cuts in salaries.

Second, That the salaries of teachers be placed on a parity with those of the employees of the different departments of our State government and that teachers be paid as promptly as such employees.

Third, That they provide for a reduction in the cost of school text books.

Fourth, That a copy of this instrument be mailed to our Governor, Hon. Bibb Graves, our Lieutenant Governor, Hon. Thos E. Knight, the Speaker of the House, each member of our County Board of Education, Mr. H. G. Dowling, the President of our A. E. A., Secretary, Frank L. Grove, Supt. A. L. Kellar, our Representative and Senator in the Legislature, The Advertiser, Alabama Journal and Times, and The Southern Star.
