Dear Mr. Rogers:

Replying to your letter of the 16th instant, I think it would be useless for me to see Mr. Lee relative to making any changes in the bill about which you wrote me.

All of these bills were sent from Washington and were passed with such changes as were made necessary by our Constitution. The Legislature does not meet again until April 30th. The five man Commission Board will be appointed possibly today or tomorrow.

We do not know how many bridges will be constructed under the Act to which you refer, but if many of them are erected the objection might be urged there will be too many local commissions handling these matters.

The five man commission bill I am quite sure will have one representative from the 8th district, and if he is the one whom I understand will be appointed Florence, Lauderdale and Colbert will certainly have a friend in court.
