OBITUARY

The late Reverend M. P. Burks was born January 18, 1899 in Madison County, Alabama. He was the son of the late Mr. and Mrs. John W. Burks. He confessed Christ at an early age there joining Pine Grove Missionary Baptist Church. After moving to Birmingham, Alabama he united with the Shiloh Baptist Church.

He was ordained into the Holy Ministry on the 15th day of October 1927, and was a graduate of the Easonian Seminary, Birmingham, Alabama.

He departed this life on Wednesday, February 18, 1970, at 7:15 P.M. At the time of his death Reverend Burks was pastoring St. Luke Missionary Baptist Church, which he served for twenty-four years, and Little Ezekiel Missionary Church, having served there for twelve years. Both churches are located in Athens, Alabama.

He was President of "Round Island Creek Association" and the "Round Island Creek Association District Sunday School Convention" for a number of years.
