

Some friends of mine in this County have spoken to me about an old man named Sam H. Smith, who is a pauper and has not been able to get help from the Department of Public Welfare of Alabama. He is over seventy years old and practically an invalid. He lives with his half-brother, Tom Smith, who is a tenant farmer and has little means to support his own family. I think that the man deserves help from the Department of Public Welfare if anyone does. Judge Grady Williams told me that you were going to speak to the Department in Montgomery about this matter and I am, therefore, writing you what I know about it personally.

I am delighted to hear that you have recovered your health and that you are taking an active part in affairs again. You extended me so many kindnesses while I was in the Legislature and although we may not always agree politically, be assured that I have the highest admiration for you, together with a feeling of real friendship.
