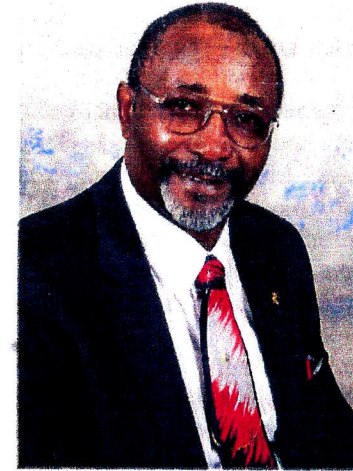

Obituary

Nathaniel Malone Jr. also known by the nickname "Billy" (a name that his parents, siblings, classmates and many associates called him) was born on October 25, 1941 in Athens, Alabama to late Ida T. and Nathaniel Malone, Sr.

Nathaniel was a very special man who was known and loved by many people. He was a church going man, an example to others of how God wants us to live. He was a sincere and dedicated family man and a leader to all that was around him and had the willingness to help everybody. Daddy was very soft spoken and always had a smile on his face. Even though his suffering is over and his soul is in heaven, he will be missed by so many people especially his children.

Nathaniel is the fifth child born to Ida T. and the first child born to Nathaniel Malone Sr. He was preceded in death by four brothers, Alphonso, Leavon, and Van T. Coleman and Joe Malone, sister, Dorothy Coleman and step-daughter, Pamela Gill.

He was raised in Christian home by parents who knew and loved the Lord. They taught him to know the Lord and seek his ways. He accepted Jesus Christ as his personal Savior at an early age. In 1958, he joined Poplar Creek Baptist Church in Athens, Alabama. He moved to Louisville, Kentucky in 1960 and became a member of Greater Salem Baptist Church in 1961 under the leadership of Rev. William H. Ryan, Sr. where he remained a faithful member until his death. He joined the Male Chorus in 1980 and was a member until his illness. He was also a member of the Interdenominational Male Chorus.

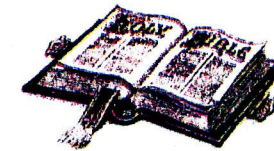

May I Go Now?

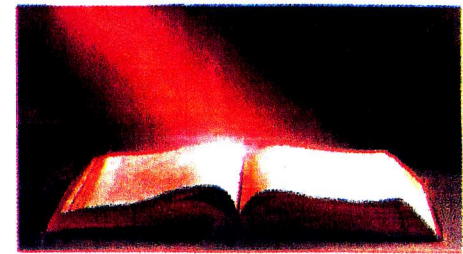
May I Go Now?
